

Riccall Community Library opens 14th May



A new venture for Riccall! We appealed for volunteers and are really thankful to those of you that came forward to help. There are now enough volunteers to open our new community library twice per week. The Parish Council has worked with North Yorkshire Library service to provide a collection of books for Riccall and these will be changed every three months.

The library will open in the bar area at the Regen Centre from **Monday 14th May** and will open on **Mondays (except Bank Holidays)** between **10am and 12noon** and **Tuesdays between 2pm and 4pm**. Please do come

along, have a coffee in the bar area and relax whilst choosing a book. There will be a wide selection to choose from, including some children's books.

The cut in services at NYCC has seen the loss of our mobile library service and the reduction in opening hours of many libraries, whilst others have closed completely. It is hoped that the community library can bridge a gap and will be a really successful initiative for Riccall, that can be developed, as it becomes more popular with residents. If you are interested in volunteering to help, then do let us know.

If you have a neighbour or friend in Riccall that can not easily get to the new library, then please feel free to borrow books on their behalf.

Diamond Jubilee projects



The Council has organised various projects around the village to commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee this year. A new bench and two flower planters have been added to the Pinfold and plants in red, white and blue will be added. Thank you to Daneshill Joinery for making these items for us. There will be some plaques added shortly to the front of the flower planters, showing the animals that would have traditionally been kept in a Pinfold and these are kindly being made by Chris Frankish. Six trees have been planted along the woodland walk at the side of the new Westfield Sportsfield, which will be opened in the autumn. Grateful thanks go to Riccall Lands Charity and a number of volunteers, shown below, who planted the trees, along with our Council Chairman. The Parish Council will present all children currently attending Riccall Primary School

and Riccall Pre-School with a commemorative coin on Thursday 31st May. **The beacon will be lit at Riccall Park at 10.15pm on Monday 4th June—please walk up with a lantern and watch it being lit.** Further details about Jubilee activities can be found on page 8.

Carr Lane closure

The Parish Council was unaware of the closure of Carr Lane, the public right of way that runs from Main Street (opposite Costcutter) to Back Lane. Linden Homes have a temporary closure notice from NYCC that operates until 1st October 2012. There was no consultation with the Parish Council about this matter. The Council Clerk has spoken to both the Rights of Way Officer and the local Highways Officer to complain about the lack of consultation with the community and is negotiating with Linden Homes to see whether the path can be re-opened as soon as possible.

Update....Linden Homes are doing some drainage work but have agreed to open the path towards the end of May. It can of course be closed anytime that is necessary up until 1st October but hopefully once the drainage work is done, it should be able to stay open most of the time.

Safer Neighbourhood Policing team for Riccall



Recently there has been a sharp increase in burglary, where the theft of the car is the main objective. We would like to take the opportunity to advise residents to review the security of their homes and vehicles. Such items as locks and alarms can be considered, alongside ensuring that keys and valuables are not left on display. Audis and VWs in particular have been targeted locally and have been stolen in Sherburn, Monk Fryston and in some other areas close to the A1.



A gentleman was visited at his home address in Selby town by a male described as stocky and having a bald head, wearing a black jacket and driving a large black vehicle believed to be a BMW. He purported to be from a company called SMARTPROOF—Total Roofing Solutions 0800 0288 104 and he provided a leaflet, which looked well worn. The male asked the homeowner for an advance of £640, which is against the company policy—after contact with the company it is believed the caller is a bogus roofer. Should any person be approached by such a male, they should be mindful as to paying money prior to services being provided and also if they are uncertain of the callers credentials. They should call the police and report the incident. The non-emergency contact number is 101.



In the early afternoon (1st May) two separate but possibly connected incidents occurred in the Abbotts Road area of Selby. In one, a man knocked on a door and asked the owner if he could come in and check the water pressure. Whilst the owner was in the bathroom checking to see if the tap vibrated, the man left with a fairly large amount of cash from the owner's purse. He is described as white, slim, 5'3" and in his 20s. He was wearing a woolly hat covering all of his hair but no uniform. In another incident, a man described as white, in his 20s, about 5' tall with spiky ginger hair, wearing a light fawn zipped jacket and light coloured trousers knocked on the back door of a property and asked if he could cut the hedge in the back garden. The owner refused and he left. Please be wary of anyone knocking on your door. Always ask for identification which will be carried by genuine callers. Report anything suspicious to North Yorkshire Police on 101.

Our congratulations go to 16 year old Riccall resident Danny Rodwell, who was nominated in May last year to be a torch bearer. He then got a phone call last November to say that he had been given a conditional offer. In January, security and background checks took place and finally Danny received an email mid-March to confirm his place. He was nominated for his participation in cycling from John O Groats to Lands End with his dad back in 2009, raising money for cancer research and also for helping to coach young players at Riccall Utd. Danny said 'It is a once in a life time experience and I feel very honoured to be given this opportunity.' He will carry the torch on Tuesday 19th June in York, although the exact location won't be available until nearer the time.

Roman gold ring - Riccall treasure

A gold ring which was found in Riccall dates back almost 2000 years and has officially been declared as treasure. An inquest in Selby declared the ring, which is made of solid gold with a blue nicolo glass setting, engraved with a representation of Apollo, weighs more than 15 grams and probably dates back to the Roman period between AD50 and AD250. The ring was found by Peter Spencer from North Leeds, during a dig in a field in Riccall in November 2010 and the British Museum has already declared an interest in acquiring it.



Thank you for your input



Many thanks to all those of you that contributed to the resident's survey. The results of which are now being fed into the Council Community Business Plan for Riccall. 77% of you were in support of affordable housing in any future developments within Riccall for both young and elderly residents. 97% of you found information within the Riccall Beacon useful. A number of you were interested in receiving information via email and we will now set those groups up to receive crime stopper reports and other local information.


74% of you rated the appearance of Riccall as good with 26% saying that it is fair. The most important things to households about living in Riccall are the sense of community, the amenities of shops, pubs and restaurants, good transport links, clean and friendly atmosphere and the low crime rate. The following are things that some of you would like to see improved: traffic management, better facilities for older people and adults, less anti-social behaviour and crime, better facilities for young people, less environmental pollution, better access onto the A19, a limit on further housing development, help for the vulnerable and young, maintaining the level of shops, businesses and doctors facilities, improved broadband speed, more events, off-road parking at Riccall Park, more flower beds, more day and evening classes.

Most of you thought that outdoor gym equipment for Riccall Park was a good idea, with over three quarters of you happy that the park is well maintained. See page 5 for the results of the youth survey.

Youth survey results

Thank you to all of the younger Riccall residents that contributed by completing our online youth survey. 68% of those completing the survey use Riccall Park at least every week with the others using it occasionally. Main hobbies and pastimes were skateboarding, BMX and music / band activities with suggestions for new activities including trampolining, ice skating and activities specifically for girls. Skate park events and competitions were high on the list. Young people generally enjoyed the clean, peaceful, friendly atmosphere of Riccall and felt safe within the community, with 60% saying that they would like to live here as an adult. Blue Sky wishes for Riccall included an ice rink, cinema, swimming pool, climbing wall, gym equipment, dance studio, football and cricket pitch, family and youth events, band rehearsal areas and recording facilities, craft clubs, sports clubs, BMX competitions and events. The over riding request was for BMX facilities.

The Council will consider all of the requests and will continue to speak to young people about their needs and wishes.

Help to keep our footpaths clear

NOTE: Being unaware of the PREVENT INFECTION BY.....

fouling, not being with the dog at the time or not having suitable equipment to remove the mess will not be accepted as a reasonable excuse – this means that the local authority has the potential to prosecute owners who let their dogs roam unattended.

Toxocariasis is one of the serious diseases which can be transmitted to humans by dogs. If you have a dog you should not allow it to foul the community's footpaths, verges, gardens and other designated areas unless you clean it up forthwith. Carry a 'poop-scoop' or encourage it to use your garden for its toilet, which you can clean up later. You can teach an old dog new tricks!

- Disposing of faeces promptly and carefully
- Worming puppies every 2 weeks from 2 weeks of age to 12 weeks, then at 6 months and every 3-6 months after that
- Using the correct worming drug (ask the vet)
- Worming all breeding bitches under the guidance of a vet
- Washing hands before handling food
- Washing children's hands after they have been handling soil or pets especially before they eat
- Prevent toddlers eating soil
